Specificity of the Product:

Ze Zeer (or Ze Tie, Ze) is pure cashmere that is hand-woven, giving local characteristics to the product. It has a soft texture, clear lines, thin-thickness uniformity, good ventilation, low static, and durability in addition to other quality characteristics. It is an example of Tibetan handmade textile products at their best. During the Ming Dynasty, it was also used as a tribute by Daju Szeto, the master of the Bazhu Kagyu school, who was in charge of the Tibetan regime. The main products today are scarves, shawls, package wrappings, and Thangka. It is made with hand-twisted wool and raw materials produced in the Tibet region.
