

RONGAN KUMQUAT (融安金桔)

Specificity of the Product: This kumquat is known for its phosphorus content, pectin and crude fiber. It has a rich flavor and is sweet and delicious. Its flavors are spicy, sweet, and sour. It is good for the liver, lungs, spleen, stomach, phlegm cough, and digestion.

According to Rongan County records, Rongan Jin kumquats were used during the Qing Dynasty Qianlong in 1758. In the town of Li Gan Tuen there still exist 19 kumquat trees that were planted more than 200 years ago. They have survived due to careful care, and these centuries-old fruit trees are green lush green with the average annual production of about 15 kilograms of kumquat. After hundreds of years of cultivation and promotion, there gradually formed the local characteristics associated with the name, along with special, excellent local varieties such as "Rongan skin kumquat" and "crisp honey kumquat".
